1. QUESTION: 2.2.1 (a) calls for an acrylic frame. However the drawings (A-608) do not show frames. Please clarify

ANSWER: Provide frameless signs.

2. QUESTION: Drawing A-608 Sign type BR1 shows the EGA logo. The description below the drawing states "NO LOGO". Please clarify

ANSWER: Provide the logo for the sign type BR1.

3. QUESTION: Drawing A-608 Sign type RM1 does not show the logo however the description calls for a logo. Please clarify.

ANSWER: A logo is NOT required for sign type RM1.

4. QUESTION: Section 23 73 33, paragraph 2.4.4 "Buried Pre-insulated Water Piping" calls for heating hot water to have prefabricated fittings. Historically on Camp Lejeune projects, we have provided field supplied fitting that are field insulated with factory supplied fitting insulation kits. Will field supplied fittings insulated with factory supplied fitting insulation kits be acceptable?

ANSWER: Specification 23 73 33 2.4.4 indicates pre-insulated buried piping.

5. QUESTION: There are no specifications for the underground chilled water piping. Will these services be pre-insulated? If so, what types of materials are we to use?

ANSWER: Specification 23 73 33 2.4.2 states that chilled and hot water piping shall be copper for all pipes 4" and below. The tailored Camp Lejeune buried piping specification 23 73 332.4.4 only indicated heating hot water piping.

6. QUESTION: Is HDPE pipe acceptable to use for underground chilled water piping?

ANSWER: Specification 23 73 33 2.4.2 states that chilled and hot water piping shall be copper for all pipes 4" and below.

7. QUESTION: Is HDPE pipe acceptable to use for underground heating Hot water piping?

ANSWER: Specification 23 73 33 2.4.2 states that chilled and hot water piping shall be copper for all pipes 4" and below.

8. QUESTION: Drawing MP102 detail 1 shows two existing chillers to remain and re-use. Upon the site visit on 11/3/21 it was noticed that there is three chillers on site with one of them appearing to be out of service with piping disconnected. Will this Chiller remain in place or will it require removal?

ANSWER: Contractor shall demo and replace both existing York chillers inside the mechanical enclosure. See attached NEW CHILLER SCHEDULE for performance requirements. The temporary Trane chiller (outside of the fence) shall remain in place and in operation to serve BEQ HP505 for the duration of the construction contract or until the new chillers are operational.

9. QUESTION: Upon the site visit on 11/3/21 there appeared to be a chiller in use that sits outside of the fenced in area at building HP202. Is this chiller to remain in place where it is currently sitting or will it relocate to inside the fenced in area?

ANSWER: Contractor shall demo and replace both existing York chillers inside the mechanical enclosure. See attached NEW CHILLER SCHEDULE for performance requirements. The temporary Trane chiller (outside of the fence) shall remain in place and in operation to serve BEQ HP505 for the duration of the construction contract or until the new chillers are operational.

10. QUESTION: Please advise how the standing water in the West Side 1st Floor Mechanical Chase will be remediated?

ANSWER: It will be the responsibility of the contractor to remediate the standing water in the 1st floor mechanical chase.

11. QUESTION: Please advise how the mold present in the ACT and Drywall Ceilings in the 1st Floor Lounge will be remediated?

ANSWER: It will be the responsibility of the contractor to remediate the mold in HP504. Building HP504 - Mold Remediation SOW is attached.

12. QUESTION: Spec 101400.20 INTERIOR SIGNAGE, page 2, part 2.2.1 a states "Frame shall be molded acrylic, 1/4" thick". Drawing A608, Sign Component depiction shows NO frame, only a black plate. Which is correct frame (Spec) or no frame (drawing)?

ANSWER: Please refer to answer for question 1.

13. QUESTION: Drawing AD103 states the following: "The contractor is responsible for removing the furniture from the building. Base Property will survey the furnishings to determine what is serviceable vs. unserviceable and mark the furniture for the contractor."

Specification section 02 82 16 sub-paragraph 3.3.1 "Furnishings" indicates the following: "Furniture and equipment will be removed from the area of work by the Government before asbestos work begins."

Which is correct?

ANSWER: Drawing note is correct. Disregard the furnishings directive in the abatement specs.

14. QUESTION: Attached is a product made by Sherwin Williams for the resinous flooring. Can you please review the product to let me know if it can approved for use?
